- Lots of money spent on employing consultants for the Greening Phoenix Road project
- Not much confidence in the British Library extension consultation
- What happened to the 2016 report into mental health amongst the Bangladeshi community?
- 'Connect the dots' make people aware of what's going on in the area
- Hold something like this (community conversation) for young people
- Sarah E made a passionate statement about the need to get more disabled residents involved in community life
- We need more debt advice and advice around managing money and benefits (Universal Credit)
- Lack of transparency around who is winning funding bids – are they from the community?

Ideas for social action and any follow-up

- Employ someone in neighbourhoods to connect local skills to people who need it/them.
- Set up instrument classes (e.g. steel pan)
